Speaker of the Honourable House of Assembly.

Sir,

On the consideration of the Petition of the Furness Withy Company, Limited, signed by us as Agents of the Company, presented to Your Honourable House on the 23rd February last, leave was given to bring in a Bill to give effect thereto.

The Company intended at that time to have one Bill prepared to incorporate the new Company and to empower it to acquire certain lands in Tucker's Town and the vicinity in the manner set forth in the Petition.

Owing however to the additional delay which would have been necessarily incurred if legislation were deferred until the whole measure had been prepared and printed, it was afterwards decided that it would be preferable to have one measure providing for the incorporation of the Company and matters incidental thereto, and another measure dealing with the acquisition of the lands required by the Company for the purposes expressed ~~in~~ in the Petition.

The first Bill has been completed and printed, and it is proposed to read it the first time in Your Honourable House at its meeting today.

It is anticipated that the second Bill will be completed in time to introduce it shortly after the first Bill has been disposed of. It cannot conveniently be introduced earlier as it must of necessity refer by name to the Company which will not be a corporate body until the first Bill has passed the Legislature.
